CCCAN SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS - DAY 5

Jamaica finished day 5 at the CCCAN Championships now on in Puerto Rico with two gold, six silver and three bronze medals, having just gained 1 gold and 1 silver medal. Timothy Wynter won gold in the 13-14 boys 200m backstroke in 2:09.55 erasing the old CCCAN record of 2:11.32 in the process. He also improved on his own national age-group record of 2:14.76 and the national senior record of 2:09.65, set by Andrew Phillips back in 1984.

The 13-14 boys medley relay team of Timothy Wynter, Kevaughn Campbell, Sidrell Williams and Antoine Young won the silver medal (4:11.84) in a new national age group record, erasing the 4:12.74 set by this same team at CARIFTA this year.
