

XIX CARIBBEAN ISLANDS SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS
Savaneta, Aruba June 23-27, 2012

Jamaica finished day 1 of CISC 2012 with seven medals - 2 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze. Gold medals were won by Annabella Lyn in the 11-12 girls 200m IM, touching in 2:36.26 which broke the old national age group record of 2:36.57, and Angara Sinclair finishing the 11-12 girls 100m backstroke in 1:12.30.

Timothy Wynter established new national senior and age-group records in winning the bronze medal in the 15-17 boys 50m butterfly. His time of 25.55 bettered the old marks of 25.94 (SNR) and 26.15 (NAGR). Matthew Lyn erased the old national age-group record (5:01.42) in the 13-14 boys 400m IM as he finished second in 4:56.01.

Other silver medal winners were Dominic Walter (4:52.28) in the 18 & Over 400m IM and Tiara Myrie (31.71) in the 11-12 girls 50m butterfly. Annastazia Chin won a bronze medal in the 11-12 girls 100m backstroke in 1:12.89.

Other finalists on day 1 were Matthew Lyn (7th 2:06.91) in the 13-14 boys 200m freestyle, Breanna Roman (7th 1:01.46) in the 15-17 girls 100m freestyle, Ramon Walton (8th 55.30) in the 18 & Over 100m freestyle, Annastazia Chin (5th 1:04.42) and Angara Sinclair (7th 1:05.70) in the 11-12 girls 100m freestyle, Alexia Royal-Eatmon (7th 30.92) in the 15-17 girls 50m butterfly and Christian Alberga (6th 30.93) in the 11-12 boys 50m butterfly.
