The Jamaican Swim team has 23 medals, 9 gold, 5 silver and 9 bronze which places them third on the medal table behind Aruba and Trinidad and Tobago.

In terms of points, Jamaica is also in third place with 328 points, Trinidad and Tobago is second with 359 points and Guadeloupe is in first place with 368 points.

In water polo action, Jamaica will meet Trinidad tonight to decide on the gold medal awardee.
