CARIBBEAN ISLANDS SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS 2014

Jamaica finished competitive swimming at the Caribbean Islands Swimming Championships (CISC) in Barbados with **twenty medals - four (4) gold, eight (8) silver and eight (8) bronze** after gaining three (3) silver and two (2) bronze medals on the last 2 days of competition.

Danielle Boothe, swimming in the 15-17 girls category, won 2 silver medals. Her first was in the 200m backstroke, touching in 2:27.21 and she returned the next day completing the 400m individual medley in 5:15.89. The other silver medal was earned by **Trudiann Patrick** in the 18 & over girls 400m freestyle, finishing in 4:53.19.

Trudiann Patrick again hit the medal tables, winning the bronze medal in the 18 & over girls 50m butterfly in 29.50. The other bronze medal was won by **Sidrell Williams**, also in the 50m butterfly. He finished in 26.25 in the 15-17 boys event.

The other finalists on day 4 were Leanne McMaster $(35.99-4^{th})$ in the 15-17 girls 50m breaststroke and Alexia Royal-Eatmon $(2:36.82-5^{th})$ in the 18 & over girls 200m backstroke. Day 5 finalists were Annastazia Chin $(1:01.75-6^{th})$ in the 13-14 girls 100m freestyle, Joseph Black $(55.01-4^{th})$ in the 13-14 boys 100m freestyle, Danielle Boothe $(1:01.47-5^{th})$ in the 15-17 girls 100m freestyle, Timothy Wynter $(55.96-8^{th})$ in the 15-17 boys 100m freestyle and $(26.62-4^{th})$ in the 50m butterfly, Leanne McMaster $(31.27-8^{th})$ in the 15-17 girls 50m butterfly and Alexia Royal-Eatmon $(31.02-7^{th})$ in the 18 & over girls 50m butterfly.
